Wildland Fire Job Opportunity

Location(s): Boehls Camp

The Clearwater-Potlatch Timber Protective Association (C-PTPA) is seeking an Area Deputy Fire Warden to direct its fire suppression and hazard management activities in the Boehls Camp area. This area is approximately 34 air miles northeast of Orofino, Idaho at the confluence of Breakfast Creek and the Little North Fork of the Clearwater River on the Dworshak Reservoir.

The C-PTPA has pre-suppression and wildfire suppression responsibilities for lands within the district. The C-PTPA administrative office is located in Orofino and the Association maintains three camps located strategically throughout the protection area for quick wildland fire response. The Association utilizes aircraft and a lookout tower for fire detection and employs approximately 60 people including full-time and seasonal personnel.

The Orofino area, 42 miles from Lewiston, Idaho and near Dworshak Reservoir, offers many outdoor recreational opportunities including fishing, hunting, hiking and skiing.

Major Duties:

Supervise, directly or indirectly, a team of seasonal and full-time fire suppression and support staff, who plan for, facilitate and implement the safe, aggressive and effective suppression of wildland fires on the district.

Benefits:

Benefits include health, vision and dental insurance, PERSI retirement, optional PERSI Choice 401k, life and disability insurance, paid sick and annual leave as well as 11 paid holidays.

Duty Station: Boehls Camp, Idaho

Starting Wage: \$18.68 – \$24.54 per hour. Applicants not meeting all qualifications required for this position will be considered and could be hired in an underfill capacity and rate until necessary experience and training levels are met.

Work is performed outdoors, in all weather conditions, involving frequent exposure to temperature extremes as well as to dirt, dust, smoke and fire hazards. Employees may be required to work extended hours, holidays and weekends. Employees may be required to fly in fixed wing and rotary wing aircraft.
